The evening was an opportunity to celebrate the huge progress the Trust has made over the past few years with share and to the community the new partnerships we have formed to fund health and wellbeing initiatives around the local area.



Following feedback at our 2023 AGM, we were delighted to share the launch of The Poppy Club in partnership with Eternity Care Services Ltd (ECS). The club, which is being subsidised by our Charity, offers fun, care and companionship for its members and some much needed respite for carers. We were also joined by the Countess of Chester Hospital team, who outlined current services and their future plans to develop the Tarporley facility further as an outpatient and community care hub.

This year we committed over £123,000 in grant funding, helping other charities deliver projects to enhance our physical and mental health and wellbeing.

- Cardiac Risk in the Young free heart screening for young people aged 14-35
- The Poppy Club a subsidised day care service for elderly members of our community
- Tarporley Victoria Junior Football Club equipment and coaching courses to support neurodiverse children
- Kelsall Wellbeing Hub art classes for people with dementia and their carers; young people's mental health workshops; community mural leading to sensory garden
